Review of Monthly Department Reports:

Court Reports provided by both Justices Ostrander and Buchanan; reviewed and approved.

Old Business:

- Accessible Ramp Covering: Supervisor Myers provided further information and a quote from Jamestown Awning. Further information to be gathered by Supervisor Myers in regards to warranty coverage and to obtain sample of awning material being proposed for use. The proposed cover will include "wind curtains" to enclose the ramp, which curtains will have "window" openings to permit natural lighting and visibility. Proposed cost for cover and curtains is \$6160.00 before the deduction of the donation provided from the Historic Society to offset cost. A tax-exempt letter will need to be provided to Jamestown Awning.

- Zoning: “In-Home Business Permits”, after discussion, it was decided by the Board that no action on this topic will be taken at this time and to leave “as is”.

Supervisor Myers stated that the NYSERDA grant for the lighting projects is “moving along”, when the time arrives, a resolution will need to be passed to change them out. National Grid will change the lighting out and will be permitted to dispose of them. Discussion regarding the cost involved, Supervisor Myers to investigate possibility of getting at the lower cost with use of a rebate rather than the original cost submitted for the grant.

Supervisor Myers opened the floor to County Representative John Davis who shared information regarding his attendance to the “Workers Memorial Services” that the County has lost 140+/- individuals either on the job or while working in the past 200 years. The County has approved an “Animal Abuse Registry” in which individuals convicted of abuse or cruelty cannot own or have animals, the registry is not retroactive and currently is more directed to livestock animals, not domestic “family” animals i.e. canines. Supervisor Myers thanked Mr. Davis for attending.

Clerk Davis brought up a “Topic of Interest”, requesting input and support from the Town Board in her organizing a Town “Swap Day” at the Town Transfer Station. This is an opportunity for the residents to bring good usable items to the transfer station and “swap” them for other items. There is no cost or money involved and leftover items will be donated to the Second Chances Thrift Store which is connected to the Humane Society. All items will be cleared away by Clerk Davis at the end of the event. After discussion and input the Board was in support.

With no further business to come before the Board, Motion was made by Councilman Ostrander and Seconded by Councilman Ron Johnson to Adjourn. Meeting was adjourned at 7:30pm
